

INDICATORS TO WATCH FOR IN SCHOOLS



Are fearful, anxious, depressed, submissive, nervous, or paranoid



Experiences changes in relationships



Shows signs of ownership, such as tattoos, brands, and jewelry used by traffickers to mark their property



Has expensive items, such as hairstyles, manicures, cell phones, clothes, and excess cash, with no known source of income



Appears malnourished, sleep-deprived, or in need of medical care



Displays a dramatic personality change, evasive behaviour, and disengagement from school, hobbies, family, and friends



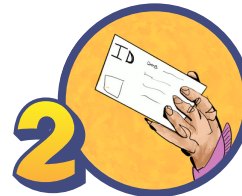
Is a chronic truant, runaway, or homeless youth



INDICATORS THAT A PERSON MAY BE AT RISK OF *Sexual Exploitation & Human Trafficking!*



HAS MULTIPLE CELL PHONES



INCONSISTENCIES IN INFORMATION AND
LACK OF ID



HAS HOTEL ROOM KEYS



PROTECTS THE PERSON WHO IS HURTING
THEM AND IS NOT ALLOWED OR ABLE TO
SPEAK FOR THEMSELVES



LACKS KNOWLEDGE OF A GIVEN
COMMUNITY OR WHEREABOUTS

If the victim is under 18, it is mandatory under provincial and federal law to report any case of suspected or known sexual exploitation.

School staff are to follow school protocol on child abuse to report suspected human trafficking activity.
